INTRODUCTION

The Railway Preservation Society of Ireland has pleasure in announcing its 50th International Railtour.

The railtour extended weekend will feature two locomotives from the following - former LMS(NCC) 2-6-4 tank locomotive No.4, former GNR(I) 4-4-0 compound locomotive No.85 "Merlin" or former GNR(I) Q class No.131.

This document outlines the itinerary and important details of train travel options and other choices available. Please use the accompanying Booking Form to make your decisions. **Return to the address provided, but no later than Monday 15**th **April 2019** to enable the administration process to be completed, hotels notified and tickets posted in good time.

The Society has secured a number of rooms in selected hotels. Booking rooms through the Society is optional. There will be a high demand for single rooms in Dublin; these are very limited, so you may wish to think about alternative arrangements there.

Every effort will be made to adhere to the proposed arrangements, but with any railway operation there is always a chance of an unplanned late change.

Full departure timings will be issued with your tickets on Saturday 27th April.

MAIN ITINERARY

The Waterford & Limerick Railtour fare covers train travel from Saturday 11th to Monday 13th May inclusive.

Saturday 11th May - Waterford & Limerick Railtour

Dublin (Connolly) - MP3 Parkway - Dublin - Kilkenny - Waterford

The day starts at 09:15 with a return trip to M3 Parkway, the terminus along the former Clonsilla Junction to Navan line. After taking water at Connolly shed we depart for Waterford at 12:00 using the Phoenix Park line to Islandbridge Junction at Heuston. The first stop after deviating from the Cork main line at Cherryville Junction will be Athy where water will be taken from a tanker. A stop is planned at Bagenalstown to cross a service train. Kilkenny arrival is scheduled for 14:25. Following an obligatory water stop we depart with a Waterford arrival planned for 17:00.

Sunday 12th May - Waterford & Limerick Railtour

Waterford - Limerick - Waterford

Special permission has been granted to use the Waterford to Limerick Junction line, normally closed on a Sunday. Departure off Waterford will be around 09:50 with various photo stops en route. A one hour stop is planned in Limerick departing at 14:05 with a Waterford return for 17:05.

Monday 13th May - Waterford & Limerick Railtour

Waterford - Dublin (Connolly) - Belfast (Lanyon Place) - Whitehead

We depart Waterford at 10:20 and use the Lavistown Direct Curve avoiding Kilkenny. Water will be taken again at Bagenalstown with a 'top up' stop at Athy. A quick run along the Cork main line will see a Dublin Connolly return at 13:30. Departure for Belfast and Whitehead using the Mk2 carriages is scheduled for 14:30. A lie-over is required at Dundalk to permit the Enterprise to overtake. The train will be shunted empty to the loop parallel to the platform.

FRINGE ITINERARIES

Thursday 9th May - Positioning Train

Whitehead - Belfast (Lanyon Place) - Portadown - Dundalk - Drogheda - Dublin (Connolly) Either locomotive No.131 or No.4 will haul the train comprised of Mk2 stock. Departure from Whitehead will be at 09:05. The train will pick up at Carrickfergus, Belfast Central, Lisburn and Portadown. Dublin arrival is scheduled for around 13:45

Friday 10th May - The Knocknarea (diesel) Railtour

Dublin (Connolly) - Mullingar - Sligo - Mullingar - Dublin (Connolly)

Friday is diesel railtour day. Unfortunately Galway has had to be dropped due to Friday pathing issues west of Portarlington with Friday only trains; meaning a too-late return to Dublin.

Departure from Dublin Connolly is at 10:00 with the Cravens set. Following a lie-over in Sligo we return to Dublin Connolly for 20:00. Our previous visit to Sligo on a Friday was in 2013. Locomotive hauled trains on the Sligo line are very rare.

Sunday 12th May - Waterford & Suir Valley Railway

Waterford (Bilberry) - Kilmeaden - Waterford (Bilberry)

Travel on this 6½ mile narrow gauge line along the former Waterford, Dungarvan and Mallow line is recommended. Seating is limited to 70. Bilberry is close to the site of the original station Waterford South; 0.5 miles from the main road river bridge. Departure is scheduled for 18:20 and return for 19:45.

Tuesday 14th May - Coach Tour

The weekend wind-down coach tour departs from the Europa Bus Centre, Stand 2 at 09:30. The itinerary includes a visit to HMS Caroline a decommissioned C Class light cruiser built in 1914 and is the sole surviving ship that featured in the 1916 Battle of Jutland. This is followed by a coach tour featuring the Groomsport to Donaghadee coastal route for lunch at the Moat Inn Bistro. Time permitting we drive along the Ards Peninsula to Ballywalter then to Greyabbey on the Strangford Lough side of the peninsula. Our day ends with a guided tour of Parliament Building, Stormont. Return (traffic permitting) via Belfast Lanyon (Central) to set down is planned for 17:00.

Tuesday 14th May - Whitehead Railway Museum

Instead of the coach tour participants may wish to visit the museum which will be opened specially from 10:00 to 12:00. A special reduced admission charge will apply.

(There is a direct train connection from Belfast's Great Victoria Street to Whitehead NIR).

SEATING

There will be allocated seating for the Waterford & Limerick and Knocknarea Diesel Railtours.

Milepost seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. If you would like a milepost seat please write "Milepost seat for ..." in the Information box on the booking form. Please also indicate which section of line as mileposts may be on different sides throughout the weekend.

The train will be for the sole use of railtour participants.

TRAIN TIMINGS

Principal departure times will be confirmed with the issue of tickets. Detailed timings for the weekend will be issued on board the train.

ACCOMMODATION

HOTELS

Hotel bed and breakfast accommodation arranged through the Society is at reduced rates. This is optional, and customers are at liberty to make their own arrangements. Single rooms are very limited in availability. Some hotels will release rooms after the single occupancy allocation is complete, but at full occupancy tariff. All hotel prices are inclusive of VAT. We shall endeavour to allocate your accommodation in your preferred hotel but experience shows this is not always possible. In such circumstance an alternative hotel will be used, if available.

The Society has pre-booked hotel accommodation based on the demand for the May 2018 railtour. For Dublin this may not now meet the potential demand, especially from those seeking single rooms.

All hotel rates quoted are 'per person' per night.

Note: We cannot take requests for specific hotel needs beyond the options we have available here. If you have special requirements it is recommended that you arrange your own accommodation.

There is no guarantee that we can supply a hotel place, especially in Dublin, as the hotels we use have a limited number of beds available.

If received between 14 and 28 days before the commencement date a 90% refund will be made, less the administration charge.
